Understanding & Avoiding Elder Scams



Elder fraud cost Americans over the age of 60 more than \$966 million in 2020, according to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center. It's a growing problem as criminals increasingly use online scams to target older adults, especially those who are living alone.

There are many types of scams targeting senior citizens, but they all share common traits:

- You receive unusual and unsolicited correspondence from a known organization.
- You win a contest you didn't enter.
- You're told there's a problem with your account.
- · You feel pressured to act immediately.
- You're given oddly specific instructions on payment.
- · You're asked to keep secrets.

If you believe you or a loved one is a victim of a fraudulent scheme, immediately stop communicating with the scammer. Keep a close eye on financial accounts and other personal accounts for suspicious activity. Change passwords if you fear online accounts may have been compromised. Write down everything you can remember about the situation while it's fresh in your memory. Record the date and time as well. All of this information could be useful if you file a report later.







Making the Outdoors Accessible for Everyone

Natural Missouri has so much to offer, from stunning scenery to wild woodlands and awesome state parks, conservation areas and even a national forest. No one should be kept from these beauties because of a disability, illness or mobility challenge. With the help of supporters and partners, the Missouri Conservation Heritage Foundation (MCHF) works to provide funding for outdoor opportunities for everyone interested. In partnership with the Missouri Disabled Sportsmen, a volunteer-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, outdoor opportunities are available to all.

Founded in 2008, their mission is to provide mobility-impaired youth and terminally ill youth and outdoor enthusiasts with hunting, fishing, shooting sports and outdoor educational opportunities in a safe and inclusive manner throughout the state of Missouri. Missouri Disabled Sportsmen serves 300 individuals annually through their programs, and roughly 70% of those participants are mobility impaired.

Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) is also a key partner on many of their events and supports their mission with logistical and staff support,

equipment and marketing. Their statewide network of volunteers also provides access, mentorship and support for the individuals they serve.
